## From the President's Desk



Dear Friends,

Last year was a terrible one for everyone and children were seriously affected. The year began with children confined to their homes for weeks on end. They were unable to interact with their friends and play and this must have had a profound impact which we will know only in the years ahead. Further for most of the year schools have been closed, particularly in urban areas. This is having a very deleterious effect on children's education. The digital divide has rendered a number of children to be out of education due to a lack of devices to access online education. Many of the younger children have forgotten how to read and write while older children are no longer interested in going back to school. Families had a huge resource crunch as parents lost their jobs and then ran out of savings too. The result was children slipping into malnutrition.

We at CASP did our best to help the children out but were hampered by the lockdown and lack of transport facilities. Nevertheless we did venture out almost immediately and did our bit. This meant our employees were exposed to the virus and a few even got infected. However I am glad to be able to share that we didn't lose anyone to Covid.

As the year came close to the half way mark another earth shaking event took place. The government amended the FCRA law and prevented transfer of foreign contributions from one NGO to another. This had two major impacts for CASP. Firstly we had to immediately terminate our long standing partnership with Rajagiri College of Social Sciences. We however ensured that the children did not suffer and requested the donors to fund the college directly. Secondly the CASP Plan project in Delhi, which was entirely funded by Plan India had to be phased out. This led to a financially stressful situation as we had to give them notice and terminate their employment which entailed making a full and final settlement including payment of gratuity. Since there were a large number of employees many of who had served with CASP for many years the settlements were for large sums. I am happy to say that Plan India have lived up to their partnership commitment and reimbursed CASP for all these payments.

In Mumbai the first intervention was to provide marginalized families with food support. This was done from funds provided by donors and also coordinating with other agencies who were running similar interventions. Our staff tried to engage children with online classes but the lack of devices was a challenge. Nevertheless we pressed on and over time children got the hang of it and began to participate. By July the office had opened again but there was little public transport. The lack of local trains meant that there were difficulties for employees who lived at a distance. Thus many had no choice but to leave our employment. Despite all these issues we continued to work with schools and provided them with remedial education, and improved infrastructure.

In Pune too the earliest intervention was provision of food support. Numerous families who were out of work and had run through their savings were provided with rations. Menstrual hygiene products and handwash liquid too were provided. As the year wore on small groups of children were brought together in communities and coaching classes were resumed with social distancing.

In Delhi too food support was the first intervention along with supply of handwash liquid and menstrual hygiene products. Later the various remedial education classes and study groups formed WhatsApp groups and assignments were shared on these.

In Gujarat too with schools closed and coaching classes prohibited children's education suffered. Our staff tried to reach out to children through individual home visits but this couldn't achieve much due to the ratio of staff to



children.

In Raigad the special intervention of providing some children with Tablets with the Byjus educational material loaded proved to be a boon for the five children selected for this interevent. They have made the most of it while other children are trying to make do with the online classes.

All said the movement restrictions and overwhelming fears were no match for our determination to reach out to children their families and communities. Our interventions continue to help children grow both physically and intellectually and we will continue our work until it is no longer needed.

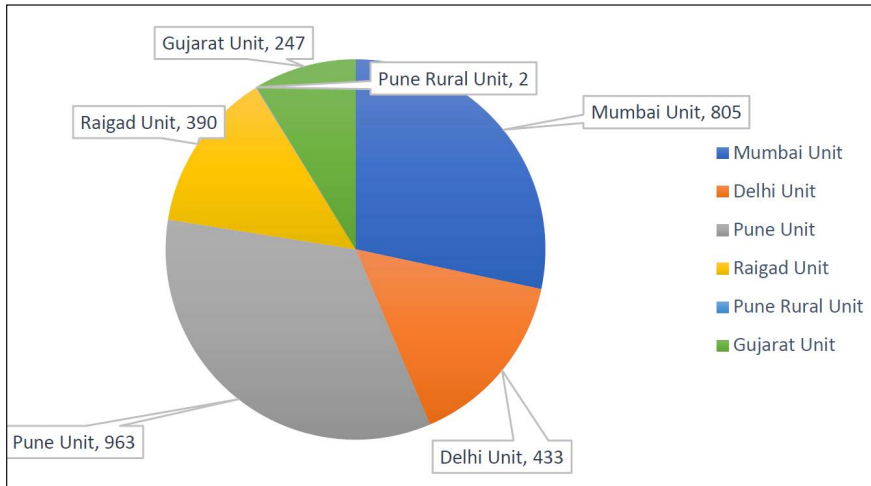

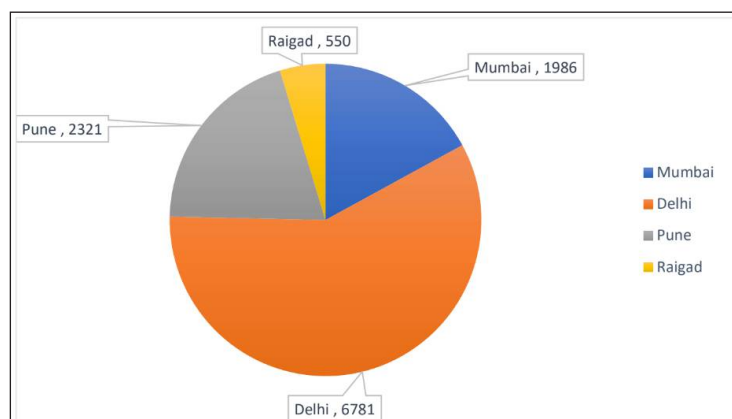

## COVID RESPONSE

CASP has long been involved with disaster response thus we rose to assist the people immediately this time too. There was of course the risk to the staff but as committed social workers nobody ever faltered.



The immediate requirements were to provide food support as there was a sudden and catastrophic loss of income and also the need to create awareness regarding protection from infection. The activities were

## EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT



## EARLY CHILDHOOD

The restrictions on movement and closing of schools by the government prevented CASP from running the balwadis (pres-schools). In Mumbai, Delhi and Raigad District. children could not be brought to one location and gatherings were prohibited.

The few restricted activities that took place were in the three wards of the Pune Municipal Corporation area implemented by Pune Rural Unit with support from Yardi Software India Ltd –

### Training

- 466 Mothers were provided with training on Early Childhood care and nutrition.

### Clinics

- 36 Community based clinics to identify malnourished children were conducted.
- 176 malnourished children were identified and provided treatment

### Referral

- 5 children were referred to government facilities for treatment.

### Nutrition Support

- In Mumbai Unit 95 Malnourished children were provided with protein supplements. This was supported by Bal Asha Trust.

### Anganwadi Support

- Three anganwadis with 85 children attending were supported by CASP Raigad Unit.











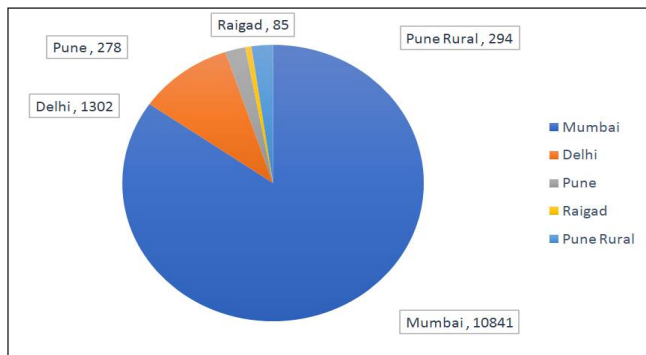
## EDUCATION



# EDUCATION

Supporting the education of children has been a cornerstone of CASP programmes right from the time of establishment of the organization. Due schools being closed due to the pandemic and most of our beneficiaries not having smartphones online classes were difficult. However the staff developed innovative means of ensuring that children continued to study. During the unlock period, Adult education classes started in open in Noida Project supported by HCL Foundation.

## Geographical Distribution of Beneficiaries



### School Development

- Ten schools were benefited by a Comprehensive School Development Project in Mumbai and suburbs. This was supported by Plan India.
- 10841 (Girls: 5493. Boys: 5348) children benefited from the Comprehensive School Development Project of Mumbai Unit during the current year.

### Basic Literacy

- 350 women were provided this in NOIDA. This was supported by HCL Foundation.

### Bridge School

- 72 women and older girls were provided with support to continue their education and appear for exams of the NIOS. This was supported by ORACLE

- 62 students in Class X in Pune were given aptitude tests to help choose their stream of further education.

### Guidance for Board Exams

- 80 students appearing for the Class X exams attended a guidance seminar in Raigad.

### Out of School

- 400 children who are out of school were provided with basic education in NOIDA. This was supported by HCL Foundation.
- 203 children were enrolled in 26 schools by Pune Rural Unit. This was supported by Yardi Software India Ltd.

### Supplementary Education

- 480 children in Madanpur Khadar, Delhi were provided with supplementary education. This was supported by Haldor Topsoe India Pvt Ltd.
- 91 children were provided supplementary education through 6 classes by Pune Rural Unit. This was supported by Yardi Software India Pvt Ltd.

### Financial Support

- 29 children in Mumbai Unit provided fee support by Sumeet Foundation.
- 37 children in Mumbai Unit provided fee support by Bombay Community Public Trust.

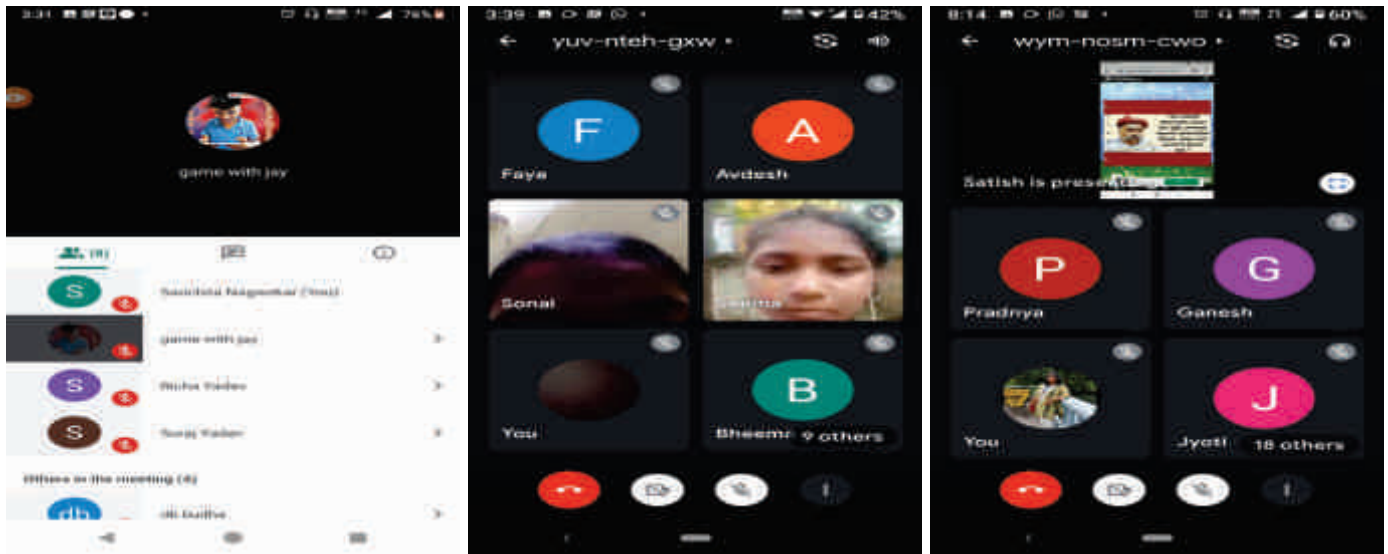
### Mobile Devices

- 84 students in class 9th & 10th Pune Unit were provided mobile recharge for 3 months under ICDP Project.

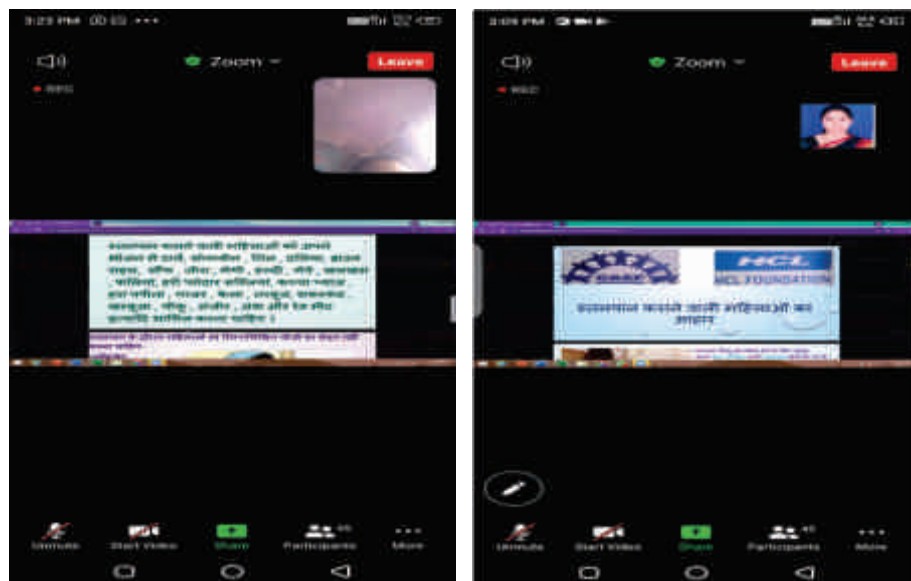

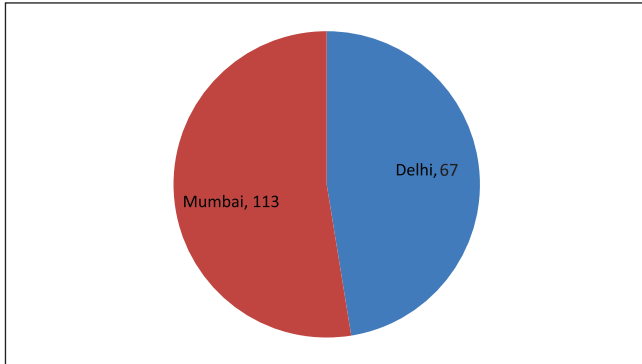




## SPECIAL PROJECTS

CASP has been supporting children with special needs for some years now. Like all other interventions these too were severely restricted by the restrictions placed by the pandemic.

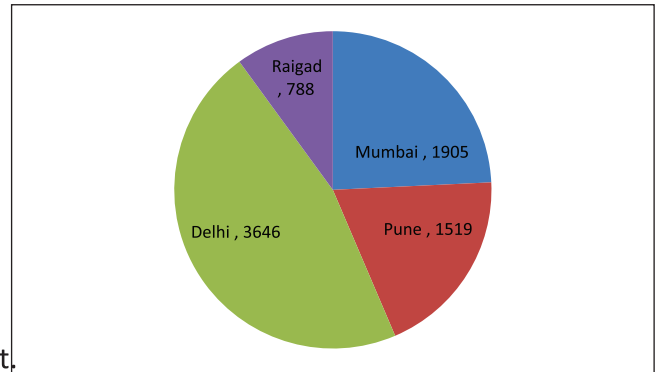
# HEALTH

The pandemic that dominated the last year ensured that health was an issue which was viewed from an entirely new perspective. Also the prohibitions on movement and gathering ensured that most of the traditional interventions had to be recast

Nevertheless the staff of CASP ensured that their outreach to the marginalized and disadvantaged continued.

This was possibly the only area where CASP Plan Delhi was able to intervene before being suddenly phased out.

## Geographical Distribution of Beneficiaries



### Checkups

- 4 camps were held in Delhi with support from HCL Foundation. 140 people benefitted
- Teleconsultation was provided in Delhi with support from HCL Foundation
- In Mumbai Unit General Health check up camp organised for children through Nair Hospital
- In Pune, Hb testing was organised for 687 girls 32 parents across three wards of the Pune Municipal Corporation. This was supported by Yardi Vasti Vikas Prkalp

### Awareness Session

- Personal Health and Hygiene Sessions were conducted for 30 girls on two occasions in Delhi. This was supported by HCL Foundation.
- Personal Health and Hygiene Sessions were conducted for 400 girls in Pune. This was supported by Yardi Vasti Vikas Prkalp

### Menstrual Hygiene

- A session on Menstrual Health and Hygiene was conducted in Delhi. Twenty girls participated. This was supported by HCL Foundation.
- 400 girls across 3 wards of the Pune Municipal Corporation were provided with awareness on menstrual hygiene. This was supported by Yardi Software Idia Pvt Ltd.
- In Delhi 1100 sanitary pads were distributed to young girls as spending on hygiene had reduced during the period





## Covid Kits

- 960 families in Badarpur and Madanpur Khadar in Delhi were provided with masks, soap and sanitiser. This was from Plan India Sponsorship funds.
- 1196 families in Badarpur and Madanpur Khadar in Delhi were provided with masks, soap menstrual hygiene products and sanitiser. This was supported by Barclays.
- 250 families in Madanpur Khadar and 125 in Gautampuri provided with masks, soap and sanitiser. This was from Plan India Sponsorship funds. This was supported by the

  - 162 families provided with Ration kit through local net work from Mumbai Unit.
  - 1743 parents from 39 communities provided with Sanitizers, mask, handwash from Mumbai. This was supported by the Plan India Model School Project.
  - Raigad unit distributed masks to 388 families and hygiene kits (4 dettol soaps, 150 ml & 120 ml hand sanitizers, chyawanprash bottle, toothpaste, 4 tooth brushes and vaporizer) to 150 beneficiaries through the sponsorship programme.
  - Foodgrains were distributed to 370 families through the sponsorship programme in Raigad.
  - 17 families were provided with foodgrains through the donation sent by our sponsor Mrs. Pranjali Prabhudesai in Raigad.
  - In Raigad 10 families were provided with foodgrains through the donation sent by our sponsor Mr. Amit Zalkikar.
  - 2 families were provided with foodgrains through the donation sent by our sponsor Ms. Siddhi Bhagat in Raigad.

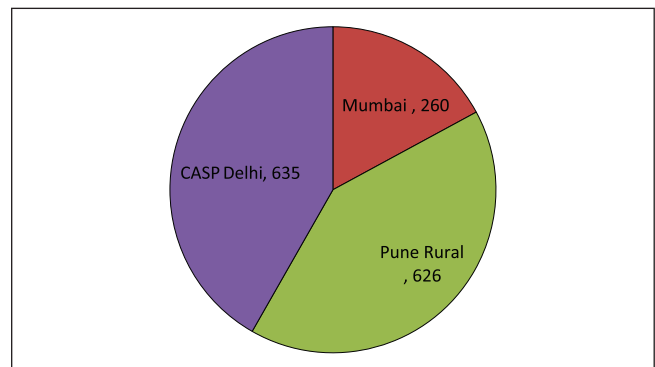


## ADOLESCENTS

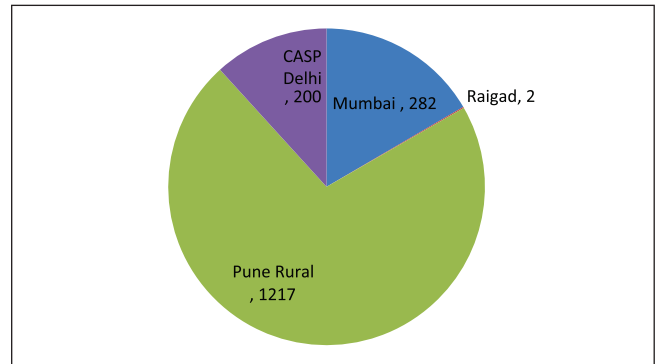


## LIVELIHOODS

Ensuring that young people and mothers have the skills to make a livelihood of dignity that pays them adequately has been a long standing part of CASP programmes. However like most of the other interventions this too suffered for most of last year due to the pandemic related restrictions.

However during periods of respite some amount of training was possible

### Geographical Distribution of Beneficiaries



#### Job Oriented Training

- 200 youth of CASP Delhi Mandanpur Khadar were provided job oriented training.

#### Tally Training

- 282 young people were provided with training in Tally by Mumbai Unit via six centres in Mumbai and Suburbs

#### Working Capital

- Two women in Raigad were provided with working capital of Rs 5,000 and 10,000. This was supported by Shri Gohad of Pune.

#### Vocational Training

- 1004 young people provided with vocational training in Pune. This was supported by Yardi Software India Pvt Ltd.

#### Job Placement

- 213 young people placed in jobs in Pune. This was supported by Yardi Software India Pvt Ltd.



## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Despite being a child centred organization CASP has long focused its interventions on community development. This is in order to create a conducive environment for the development of the child. Here too the last year saw very minimal activities due to the pandemic and ensuing restrictions.

Activities that occurred despite the lockdown were –



### Library

- A Library and E-learning Centre in Delhi benefited 650 children and young people
- In Mumbai Unit two schools were provided with books for their library and seven schools supported in previous years were provided with more books.

### Bal Panchayat

- 85 members of the Bal Panchayat in Delhi organised events to create awareness with regards to children's issues. They also recorded radio programmes and wrote a newsletter.
- 11 Bal Panchayat were formed in ten schools consisting of 374 children by Mumbai Unit.

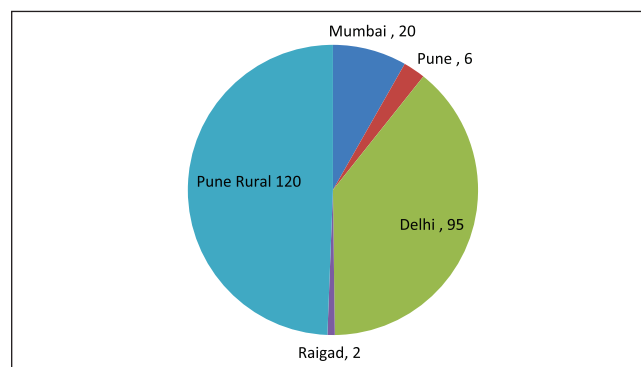


## TRAINING
